

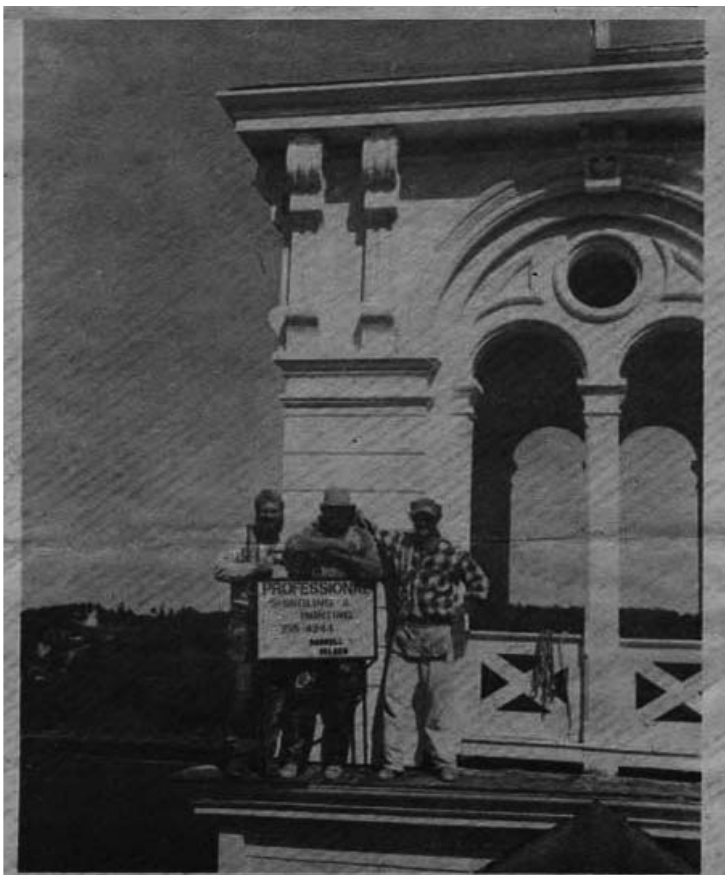
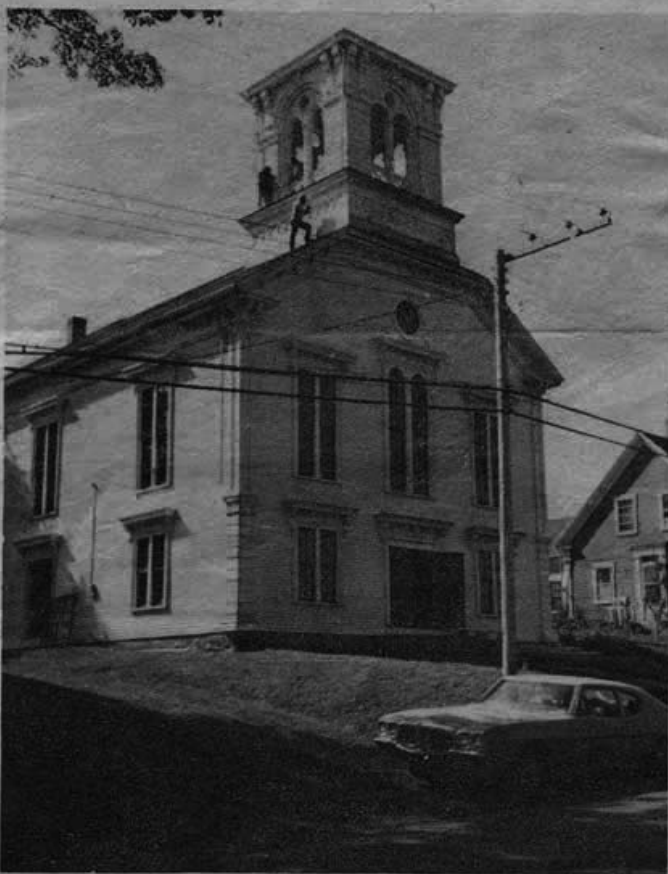
MACHIASPORT TOWN HALL GETS FACE LIFT

The Machiasport Town Hall, which is on the National Register of historic places, has just received some minor repair and a coat of paint to its exterior. The work was contracted locally to Darrell Roberts, Belden Morse and Bill Hudson. The extent of their work was done on the cupola of the building.

In an interview with Mrs. Evelyn Carroll of the Machiasport Historical Society, I learned that the town hall was erected in the early 1800's, and that at the time it was built, it was one of the finest built buildings in the country.

The hall is still used for the town municipal offices, and the auditorium is still used for plays, dinners and the town meetings. It is also used as a center for local youth activities.
